

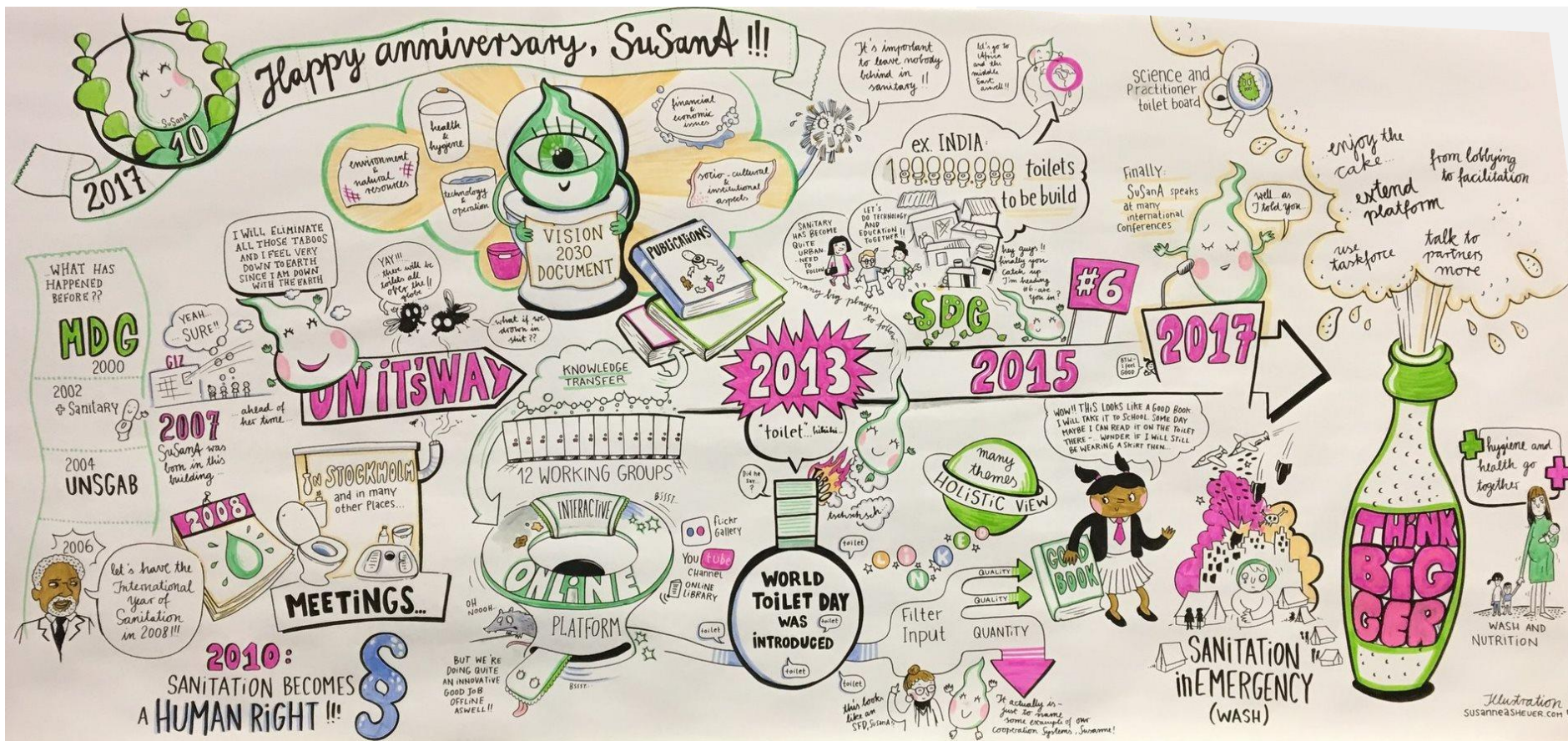

SuSanA is 10! Looking back, looking forward

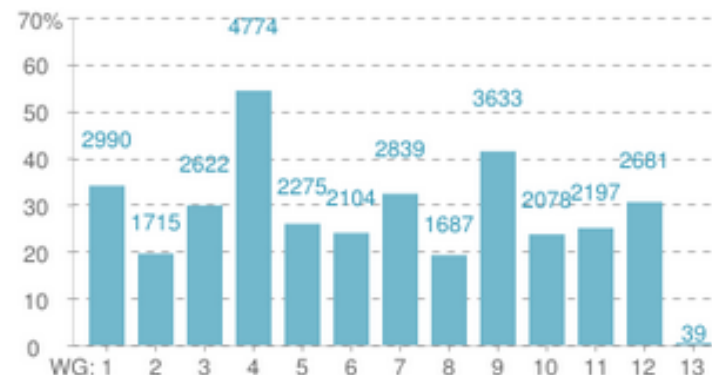


- SuSanA is an open network that wants to support achieving the SDGs in and around Sanitation



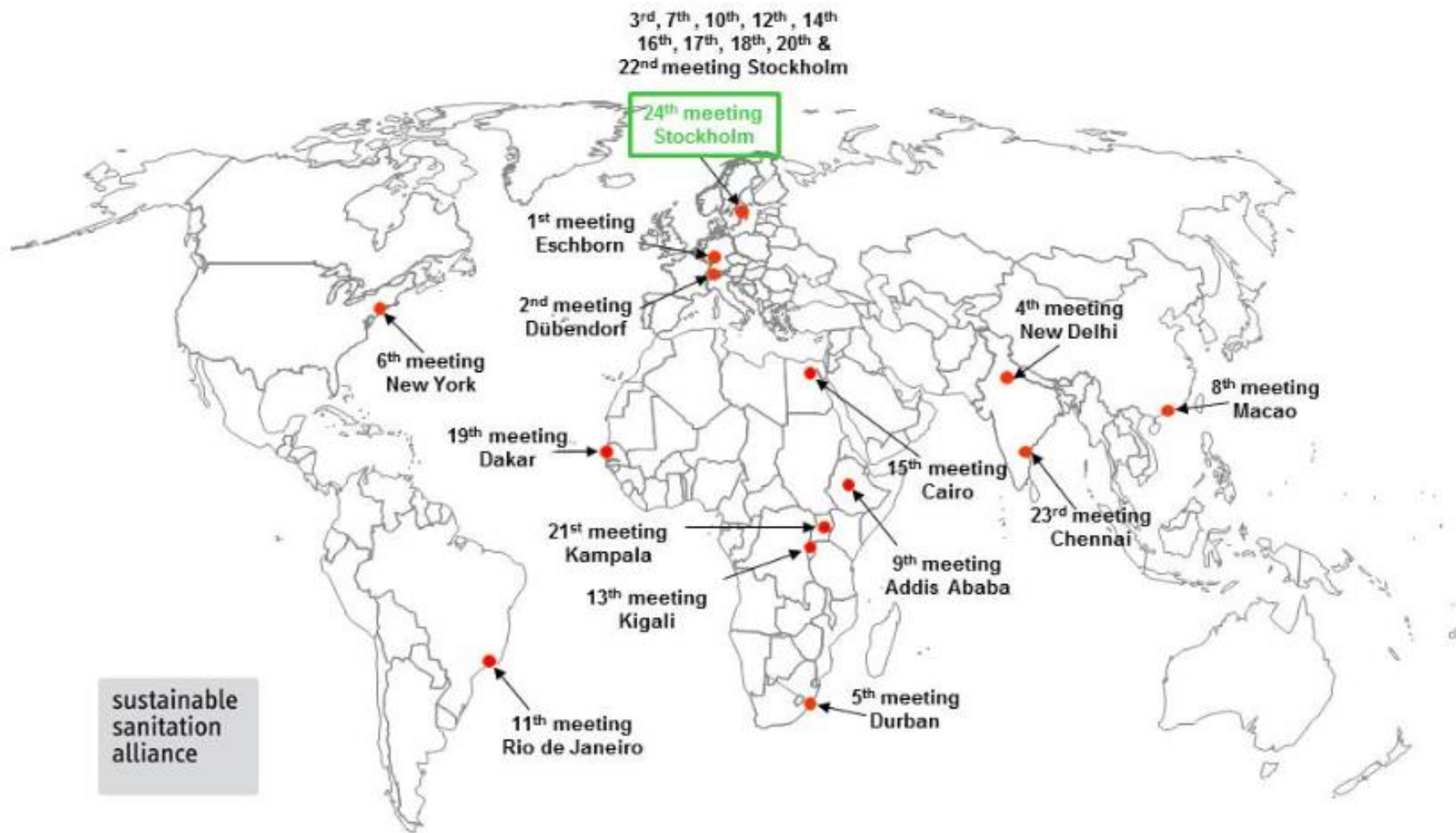

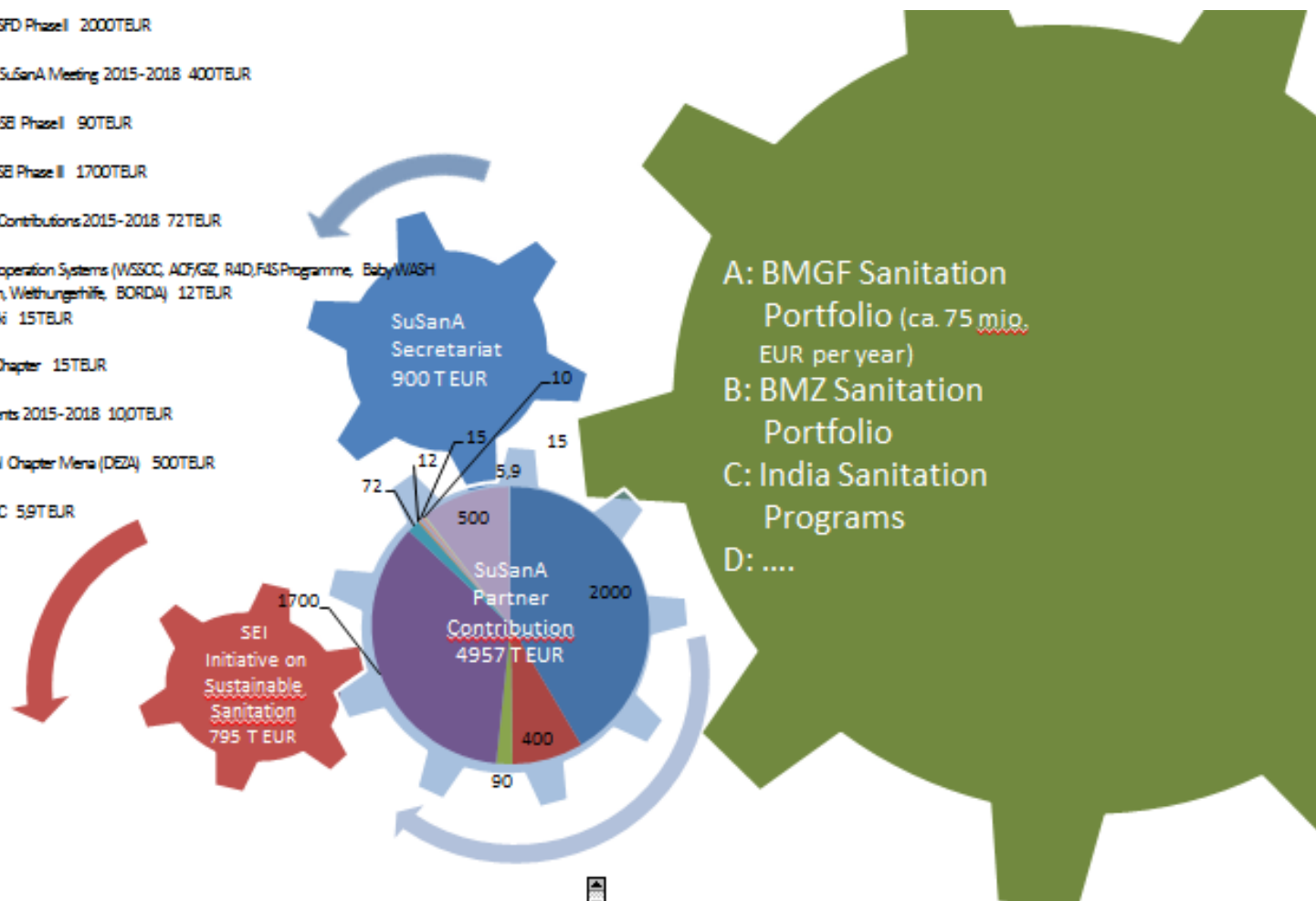

During the period 2015 to 2018, the SuSanA secretariat costs on average 900 T EUR (300 T EUR per year) to run and has an estimated 4819 T EUR leverage in the form of contributions to the network from SuSanA partner organisations. Moreover, the SEI Initiative on Sustainable Sanitation has been commissioned by SIDA for 2015 to 2019 with a budget of 265 T EUR per year for 2015 & 2016, with activities that include SuSanA. The SuSanA community does influence the BMGF spending which is 75 million Euro per year (2010-2015) on sanitation.
